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Trail Type & Difficulty

LOOP || EASY - DIFFICULT

"Loop" Trail: A trail designed so that the route is a closed circuit connecting a number of points of interest, giving hikers the option of not traveling the same section of trail more than once on a trip.

UP TO 8.3 MILES

Snowshoe the Woods Loop for a quick jaunt around Muskegon State Park or the Lake Michigan Loop and Lost Lake Trails for a more aggressive terrain and spectacular views of the lake shore. There are three trail systems, all loop trails, that serve varying skill levels from beginner through expert.

Winter activities include snowshoeing, xc skiing, ice skating, sledding and a winter luge! Yes, you can actually take luge lessons and take your turn on the ice slide. Combine as many of these activities as you can into one or two days and make your visit into a fun little winter vacation not too far from home.




Campsite Options, Entry Fees, & Parking Costs

Designated camping 20 rustic sites in the park

"Designated" - Campsites set aside in more remote areas but lack the conveniences of frontcountry campsites. Some will have lean-tos or shelters in addition to tent sites. These sites often have outhouses and sometimes fire rings. Be prepared to filter your own water.

Entry Fees & Parking Costs:

Parking: A Michigan State Recreation Passport is required. This pass gives you entry into state parks and recreation areas, state boat launches, state forest campgrounds and state trail parking lots. Passes cost an average of \$11 - \$16 and are valid for one year.
Daily trail pass: \$5 week days or \$10 weekends
Daily snowshoe rental: \$5 week days or \$8 weekends
Camping: \$33/night
